MODANVILLE SCHOOL STUDENT WELFARE and DISCIPLINE POLICY: One of the most rewarding things about Modanville Public School is the high levels of cooperation and behaviour of our students. In recognition of this, all students start the year with a 'green card'. This card allows them to participate in the full range of activities at Modanville and have access to all our facilities and equipment, eg playground, sports equipment, excursions, fun days, Lego club, sandpit, etc

From time to time some students make inappropriate choices in their behaviour and as a result they may receive a yellow, orange or red card, depending on the severity of the impact of those choices. At times, and these are extremely rare, students may even be suspended from Modanville school for more serious behaviour that requires more detailed intervention.

If your child receives a yellow, orange or red card, they are ineligible to participate in events such as excursions, carnivals and special days like tomorrow's Crazy Hair Day for a period of time. For example, students on a yellow card need to display consistent positive behaviour for the following period of time in order to return to green card status and enjoy the privileges it entails:

K - 2 days; Y1 - 3 days; Y2 - 4 days; Y3 - 5 days; Y4 - 6 days; Y5 - 7 days; Y6 - 8 days.

A most significant factor in our student's excellent attitude and behaviour is the support we receive from parents who reinforce with their children high expectations of behaviour and levels of cooperation with other students and staff, and respect and support actions taken by the school.


