Afternoon Rotations on Mondays and Tuesdays

This term in Miss Azzopardi's art lessons the students will continue to explore the different forms of art. The beginning of the term students will be creating artworks using paint and collage techniques, and later in the term the focus will move to sculpture and 3D forms. The students did a fabulous job creating pinch pots with air dry clay at the end of last term. They have been putting the finishing touches on them at the beginning of this term and most of them have now gone home.



This year our students have been developing their skills and understanding in programing and robotics through hands on activities using our iPads, LegoWeDo equipment and BeeBots. Students have experimnting with drag and drop programing and investigating how important it is to have all the necessary information in order for programing to work.

This term the senior students will be set challenges using the LegoWeDo equipment to self-design and program vehicles. They will trial how changing particular components of their designs impacts how their vehicles move and attempt to create vehicles which turn.

Our junior students will be creating vehicles and experimenting with how changing the program effects their vehicles.



Afternoon Rotations on Mondays and Tuesdays

This term student's in the K/1 and the 2/3 classes will be learning about Wet and Dry Environments. From these lessons students will examine the differences between natural features and built features within our local area.

After evaluating the changes on the environment made by humans, students will identify and suggest ways we can all care for different environmental sites.

Students in 4/5/6 are studying Rainforests, they will be exploring flora and fauna that comprise our rainforest ecosystem. They will study the impact of human development on rainforests around the world as well as identify services and goods that are produced from rainforests.


